APPOINTMENT OF DR. MANORTEY AS ACADEMIC HEAD

Starting this new year, Dr. Stephen Manortey took on the role of Academic
Head. Here is a sneak peek at his amazing profile:
Dr. Stephen Manortey is a full-time lecturer at the Ensign College of Public
Health where he serves as the Head of the Biostatistics Unit.He had his
educational training both in Ghana and the United States of America.
He holds an MSc (Statistics) from Brigham Young University and a PhD in
Public Health from the University of Utah.
He also holds a Graduate Certificate in Global Health from the University of
Utah.Dr. Manortey's research and scholarly works focus on community

engagement and evaluating the health needsof residents in rural settings. His works include using spatial analysis to assess factors that influence complete household enrollment into the National Health Insurance Scheme and also using standard verbal autopsy procedures to generate infant mortality data in selected rural communities in Ghana. He currently serves as a Principal Investigator on a project dubbed "Health2Go" with the aim of establishing a fully operational model to understand the project's impact on the health of residents in selected "hard-to-reach" communities in the Lower Manya Krobo Municipality in the Eastern Region of Ghana.

LEADERSHIP CORP PROGRAM

Ensign College of Public Health has developed a specialization in leadership as an integral element of each student's educational experience. Beginning this year, students will be offered a chance to develop leadership capabilities by participating in a new extracurricular program known as the Ensign College of Public Health Leadership Corps. This program is designed to jointly provide students with quality experiences serving in leadership roles to advance Ensign College of Public Health through a series of institutional initiatives. Students accepted into the Leadership Corps will be required to participate in leadership training through programs such as Developing the Leader in You and Application of Good to Great. This extracurricular training will prepare students to contribute their time and talents to one of the institutional initiatives.

Students who participate in the Leadership Corp for 30 hours a semester will be offered a tuition break of Gh¢1,500 for that semester – with a total tuition reduction each year of up to Gh¢3,000. Students who participate in this program for both the 1st and 2nd semesters will receive a certificate of achievement for service in leadership.

SCHOLARSHIPS & AWARDS Kenneth R. Young Scholarship

In its second year of disbursement at the Ensign College of Public Health, students still continue to benefit from the Young Family Scholarships – an award of GHs 2,250 per student made available to three students per year. These generous annual donations from the Young Family are in memory of a father and grandfather who never had the opportunity to attend a university. Three students received awards this academic year 2019/2020. A total of six ECOPH students have received these awards.

what happened last semester? An outside the classroom learning experience! Students had the opportunity to visit the VRA Public Health Unit on 17th May, 2019. The purpose was to gain a practical field learning experience on the epidemiology of Schistosomiasis which is quite prevalent along the Volta Lake. After a lecture from the VRA team, they proceeded to a rural village called Sedorm located along the banks of the lake. They enjoyed a practical field work experience with the VRA team led by Dr. Mike Dade interacting with community members and also screening school children. About 56 out of 126 school children were screened and 41 tested positive for Schistosomiasis. Clearly, there is a lot of work to be done in this area of public health in Ghana and all hands need to be on deck.
