Dr. Edward Sutherland Joins Ensign Faculty

We are pleased to announce that Dr. Edward Kofi Sutherland, MD, MPH has joined the full time faculty at Ensign. He is a medical practitioner and a full time lecturer at the College. He graduated from a top medical university in the Russian Federation (I.M. Sechenov First Moscow State Medical University) on a full scholarship award and earned a degree in general medical practice. Dr. Sutherland has healthcare experience in Ghana and Russia and exposure to health systems in the U.K. and U.S.A. He earned his MPH in the maiden class of Ensign students. Dr. Sutherland's primary focus is on the study of the epidemiological transition trend from acute infectious diseases to chronic diseases such cardiovascular diseases, diabetes, cancers and HIV/AIDS in populations; particularly in developing countries. He is also interested in factors influencing global and community health trends; the critique and understanding of health systems as well as the engineering of sustainable strategic partnerships between governments and nongovernmental organizations towards the achievement of health equity.

He is passionate about evolving health technologies both diagnostic and curative and is bridging the gaps of innovative medical scientific technologies and scientific knowledge between privileged populations and underserved populations. He serves as the Medical Director at Ensign and oversees activities of the University of Utah Center for Global Surgeries in Ghana and West Africa. Dr. Sutherland is also Clinical Advisor for the "Health 2 Go" project in the Lower Manya Krobo Municipality in the Eastern Region of Ghana. Academic Board Meeting Held March 7, 2018

Chaired by our President, Professor Stephen Alder, attendees included all academic staff. Ensign's KNUST affiliate representative, and the Ensign GRASAC rep. THe meeting covered academics, the University of Utah Extended Program, new faculty and faculty turnover. Board of Governor approvals, and approval of external examiners. The student rep raised a few issues leading to this discussion:

Access to Turn-it-in: Turn-it-in is a software to detect plagiarism. It is not available at this time to students. Students are encouraged to use good academic practice in order to avoid plagiarism.

Student concerns about the course/faculty evaluations: The college is taking steps to assure annonymity to evaluations and they are not mandatory. However, students should know that evaluations are important for improving teaching and learning at Ensign.

Student inquiries about faculty qualifications: The KNUST rep and Prof. Alder clarified that a PhD is not a requirement for tertiary institution. A terminal degree such as a PhD or MD or JD or Dr.PH are all acceptable.

Administrative Updates

Substantive Head and Academic Registrar: Ensign now has a substantive Head, Prof. Stephen C Alder and a substantive Academic Registrar, Mr. Patrick Kuma. These appointments were ratified by the Board of Governors in December 2017.

Accreditation: The Ensign College of Public Health is currently in an on-going review status for re-accreditation by the National Accreditation Board (NAB). Concerns were expressed by students last semester about Ensign's "expired" status on the NAB website. The NAB has changed that status to "on-going" in an acknowledgement that our institution has submitted our reaccreditation application as is in review. The NAB has experienced a back log of applications and is working to catch up on this matter. We had a fruitful site visit on campus in January by the NAB and we are hopeful they will soon be able to make a positive determination.

Student Handbook: The student Handbook was recently updated by the administration and ratified by the Board of Governors. Please find attached and on the ECOPH Website.

ECOPH Statutes: The statutes for our organization were recently updated by the administration and ratified by the Board of Governors. Please find attached and on the ECOPH Website.

Updated Academic Calendar: The academic calendar, particularly the second semester (Jan – July 2018) has been updated and is included in the Student Handbook. Most notably – a clarification of an Easter break from classes the week of March 26 – 31 and shifting of thesis dates by two weeks. Theses are due to the college on March 26th and the new defense date is March 22, 2018.

Univeristy of Utah Extended Program: All documentation has been submitted to the NAB and we are hopeful for a decision in the near future. Our hope is to be able to announce and recruit for a new MPH degree program that culminates with a University of Utah diploma. Please stay tuned.
